Our guest speaker for March was Ron Ray a volunteer from The Maritime Museum on the history of Sydney Ferries.

Ron was a dynamic interesting speaker who kept us all enthralled with his overall knowledge and enthusiasm of Sydney Ferries.

Ferries began as the oldest form of water transport to move people, usually rowboats.

In 1800 the Rose Hill Packet was rowed with 10 tons cargo & 30 passengers & took a week to get to Parramatta.

Then Billy Blue a convict settler & ferryman rowed people from Dawes Point to Blues Point, named after him.

In 1861 the Sydney ferry company became the largest Ferry company in the world

Steam Ferries started early in 1900, moving onto diesel powered.

Ron told us some of the many fatal disasters had by Sydney ferries over the years.

One in 1938 the Rodney , where all the passengers rushed to one side to see an American Warship & the ferry overturned, killing19.

The downing of the ferry Kutabul by Japanese submarines killing 21 sailors during ww2, & many more.

He explained the change in styles of ferries, the Lady ferries, 1960's Hydro foils & River Cats to mention a few

His talk was strewn with an excellent selection of historical photographs, which bought every topic to life, It was so enjoyed by members that I had many requests for him to come again with another subject..

#### Our Guest Speaker for April is Robyn Dalton, BA Dip Ed, Grad Dip Health Admin, J.P.

Robyn has lived in the Hills District since 1974 & has been an extremely active member and former President of the Castle Hill Players at the Pavilion Theatre. Her colourful career started when she was 18 years of age and has been a significant component of her life for the past 65 years.

Robyn auditioned to Nida, by forging her father's signature (who was against a career in the theatre), only to be found out when she was a accepted and a letter came to her father. however father stood firm, so she went onto Sydney University, joined the drama society with now famous actors & the rest is history as she will tell you.

Robyn is a member of the Parramatta Riverside Advisory Board and has written a book about early theatre.

She is currently involved in the revival of radio plays performed at the Hills lodge.

Robyn is a joy to listen to and bubbles with enthusiasm.

It is also common courtesy to notify the host if you cannot attend.


